U.S. Embassy teams up to assist Thai flood victims

Ambassador Kristie Kenney and U.S. Embassy personnel teamed up to prepare cooked meals for flood victims at Bangkok University's Kluay Nam Thai Campus this past week. Embassy volunteers also joined forces with Thai relief agencies to personally deliver over 500 of theseprepared meals to residents of the hard hit Pathum Thani neighborhood. In addition to preparing meals for flood victims, the U.S. Embassy's Transnational Crimes Affairs Section donated eight inflatable motorized boats and 100 lifejackets to the Royal Thai Police to support their assistance efforts. Our embassy's Information Office has been documenting our mission wide relief efforts via our embassy webpage and on our social media outlets Twitter and Facebook where they have been garnering positive reactions by both the Thai and foreign expatriate communities.
